

## History of Raidighi College

On May 16th, 1995 at the initiative of some sincere and selfless local people and under the guidance of a number of enthusiasts, Raidighi College started functioning. Time has flown fast and Raidighi College has stepped into its twenty-fifth year.

The college is now on the pacing track of progress and success, and on the threshold of a rapid expansion of infrastructure. Yet, there are many miles to tread before the dream becomes a reality, before the vision is transformed into action.

Raidighi College is located in an area which is socio-economically backward. Natural calamities are part and parcel of the people of this locality; students who come to pursue their higher studies are from extremely poor background. They sometimes fail to pay the minimum fees of education to the college. However, to assure the development of infrastructure for the cause of the students, we generally look forward to the allocation of grants by the different Government agencies. The college, throughout the academic year, follows a process of developing some infrastructural facilities, mostly for the welfare of our students.

It needs to be mentioned here that with the help of grants from U.G.C. and Sundarban Development Board, the construction of the girls' hostel of the college has been completed a couple of years back, and now it is fully functioning. In the near future, we also wish to construct a similar hostel for boys. The hostels, as we gather from our experience of running one, benefit those students who come to the college from far off areas and are therefore, face inconvenience by the hazards long distance commute to and from the college. Among our future plans rests also the construction of an auditorium





with adequate seating capacity and all modern facilities. We also give UGC - sponsored remedial coaching classes and coaching classes, guidance for different competitive examinations to the weaker section of ST. SC and OBC students.

We also intend to set up a modern computer training centre in the college itself, which will enable not only the students of the college but the students and eager people of the entire Sundarbans area to

receive training in computers and thereby discover new and fresh means to earn their livelihood. The college acts as a Study Centre of RabindraBharati University, which enables the students of Sundarbans to receive degrees in various post-graduate courses.


The Institute considers social awareness among the students as one of the mostimportant aspects to make them good citizens. The two units of the National Service Scheme (NSS) in the college have been paving the way in this direction. The volunteers of the NSS units have been doing a lot of works for the upliftment of the people of this interior part of Sundarbans. Arranging rallies and lectures on Health and nutrition oriented awareness and other STDS have been a few of the regular activities of the NSS. Blood Donation Camp is one of its regular activities. Cleaning of major public premises, organizing awareness programmes onilliteracy eradication etc. have been made mandatory for our volunteers. In 2019, the NSS volunteers organized a special camp at Kumropara village where our teachers and resource persons informed the local community about the health benefits of exercise and yoga, and arranged a free medical check-up for all the local villagers.

Our institute believes in the holistic development of our students - both intellectually and physically. We encourage our students to participate in different sports events both on university level and society level. Our football and kabaddi teams (both Boys and girls) are performing excellently

and consistently. Our players were selected to play at the national level. Students are enthusiastic to participate in other games and sports also, though unfortunately, due to the inadequacy of fund and a fully-developed infrastructure, they are not getting optimum opportunity to show their talent.

Our students also participate in different cultural competitions. Students of Political Science Department are participating in Youth Parliament and quiz contest every year. Recently, in February 2020, at an event organized by Vijaygarh Jyotish Ray College, our students participated in different segments, and a student from the Department of Food and Nutrition was adjudged the Second Best Singer for Rabindrasangeet. They are to be appreciated in this regard. Even while living in trying conditions in this remote part of the state, they are capable of winning prizes for the college. In near future we are planning to have audio visual classes to train them.

Most of the students of this institution are of first-generation learner. They possess little knowledge about co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Still we have been trying hard to make them aware of other activities in the department. We have been providing them with opportunities to write down their own thoughts and imaginations. Wall magazines are the perfect example of their creative potential. The Geography Department has already been able to publish the 5th edition of its departmental journal 'Revolution' (Porikromon). Other departments are thinking on the same line. A few editions of different departmental wall magazines have already been published. Departmental seminars have also acquired a popular stature in our college. With the help of these, students are gradually getting ready to






interact and present regularly. Departmental get-together and educational tours are also encouraged.

Though we have not yet experienced any inter-departmental competitions, but it has been found that students are willing participate in different events, representing their respective departments. Quiz contest and debate competitions are the finest example of such activities. Our students organize 'Teachers' Day' programme every year both centrally and departmentally. The college also organizes Annual cultural competition in music, recitation, extempore, debate and quiz.

The Learning curve of our new students is fairly high as they grasp things quickly from the classes and from students of the preceding years. We have strong faith on our students that in near future they will definitely develop themselves to the extent of succeeding at different ventures after completing their degree here.







#### Personality Development:



- ➤ The Teachers' Council welcomes any new faculty with a message that highlights the noble ideas and ideals of the College.



## Opportunities:


- The College authority encourages all the teachers to take up research assignments and to participate in national and international seminars/conferences.

- The career counseling cell of the College arranges career workshop and is about to start an active liaison with the industrial houses.


## **Challenges:**

Academic Session: 2023-24



## Regulations relating to Admission for the semester wise <u>Four-Year B.A./B.Sc. (under CCF, 2022)</u> Courses of Studies

These shall apply to every student prosecuting the above Courses in Raidighi College.

#### 1. Duration of the Programme:

- The B.A./ B.Sc. Programme shall be for a minimum duration of Six (06) Semester with odd semester and even semester.
- Duration of each semester is Six months.
- The odd semester (1<sup>st</sup> /3<sup>rd</sup>) will start ordinarily in the month of July and the even semester in the month of January of every year.
- Only 1<sup>st</sup> Semester for the academic session 2023-24 will be start from August'23.
- Any student can be exit from Three-Year programme after completion of 2<sup>nd</sup> /4<sup>th</sup> Semester.
- Undergraduate degree programmes of 3 –years duration, with multiple entry and exit points and re-entry options, with appropriate certifications such as:
  - ✓ Awarded Certificate after completing 1 year ( 2 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study.
  - ✓ Awarded Diploma after 2 years ( 4 semesters) of study.
  - ✓ Awarded B.A./B.Sc. Degree after a 3-years (6 semesters) programme of study.
- A student prosecuting a regular course of study for semester wise degree course shall have to clear all semesters in all respect within a span of <u>seven years</u> from the year of admission to the particular course and combination, failing which <u>enrolment of the student shall stand</u> cancelled.

#### 2. Applicability of the Regulations:

 Students who have already successfully completed any U.G. degree earlier are not eligible to take admission into above course.



#### **I-Admission Regulations**

**3.(a)** A student who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent Examination is eligible to seek admission to the 1<sup>st</sup> year of the B.A./B.Sc. (Single-Major) Course of Studies provided the candidate has also passed in English having full marks not being less than 100 and fulfills the conditions as laid down in clause **5**, **10**, **11** and **12**.

Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Vocational examination conducted by the West Bengal State Council of Vocational Education and Training shall be eligible to seek admission to the B.A. (Multidisciplinary) 1st year Course of Studies taking the subjects under **Humanities Discipline** only.

However, no student shall be allowed to take admission after a lapse of more than 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.

(Explanation: The *year of admission shall not be taken* into account while calculating three years from the year of passing the previous qualifying Examination).

- **4. (b)** Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination or its equivalent from the All India Boards/Councils (i.e. CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling) <u>need not require to submit the Migration Certificate for getting Registration under this University.</u>
- 5. For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the B.A./B.Sc./ (Multidisciplinary) Courses, aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks in top-four subjects in order of marks secured by a student. However, marks in compulsory Environmental Education/Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks. However, if the subject "Environmental Science" is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.
- (a) Students belonging to *Reserved Categories* taking up Major Course of Study must have obtained a *minimum of 40% marks in the aggregate or 40% marks in the subject* or related subjects at the previous qualifying examination, as the case may be.
- (b) Seat reservation for admission in the first year class of three-year (six semesters) degree courses of studies shall be guided by the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission), Act, 2013 and the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Rules, 2014 and Memorandum No. 339-Edn (CS)/OM-74L/2023, dt. 26.05.2023.



#### 6. Attendance

- A student attending at least 75% of the total number of classes held shall be allowed to sit for the concerned Semester Examinations subject to fulfillment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
- A student attending at least 60% but less than 75% of the total number of classes held shall be allowed to sit for the concerned Semester Examinations subject to the payment of prescribed condonation fees and fulfillment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
- A student attending less than 60% of the total number of classes held shall not be allowed to sit
  for the concerned Semester Examinations and he /she has to take admission to the same
  Semester in the very next year for attending the classes and appearing at the said Semester
  Examination.

\*Such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or date of admission, whichever is later.

**Explanation:** A student who has not been eligible to appear at any Semester-end Examination in terms of Clause 6.3 may take admission to the next higher Semester and appear at such higher Semester-end Examinations. However, such student has to take admission to the concerned Semester, for which the candidate has been ineligible under clause 6.3, in the very next available chance without pursuing any other Semester Course simultaneously.

#### 7. Disciplines of Major & Minor subjects for B.A./ B.Sc.:

- (i) <u>Humanities & Language Discipline:</u> History, English, Bengali, Political Science, Education, Sanskrit, Philosophy, Physical Education
- (ii) <u>Science Discipline:</u> Physics, Zoology, Chemistry, Botany, Microbiology, Food and Nutrition, Mathematics, Geography, Physical Education
- (iii) Home Science Discipline: Food & Nutrition



#### 8. Outline of CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK (CCF):

#### Category of subjects:

A) **Core Course (CC):** Course, to be **compulsorily studied** by a student as the requirement of Core subject.

In order to make different Multidisciplinary subject combinations, the subjects of all the discipline have been taken together to create 8 smaller Multidisciplinary pools. The student shall select 2 subjects as core subjects taking not more than one subject from each pool

- B) Minor: A subject to be studied by students with lesser number of courses than the two core subjects.
- C) <u>Ability Enhancement Course (AEC)</u>: Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) courses are the courses based on the knowledge of languages. There shall be two AEC courses:
  - a) Compulsory English
  - b) MIL/ Alternative English
    - MIL : Bengali

#### D) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):

- These courses are designed to provide skill-based knowledge and are aimed at providing competencies, skills etc. SEC courses are based upon skill enhancement.
- Student shall study 3 SECs 2 from each of core subjects in 1st and 2nd semester respectively.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> semester 1 SEC from Minor subject.

#### E) Practical/Tutorial:


- All courses other than AEC & CVAC will have one Practical/ Tutorial.
- Whenever there is a practical; there will be no Tutorial and vice-versa.
- Inclusion of P/TU components in SECs will be as mentioned in the syllabus of the respective subject.

#### F) Common Value Added Course (CVAC):

- These courses are based on Knowledge of Human & Social Values.
- There shall be 4 CVAC courses of 2 credits each.
- In the 1<sup>st</sup> semester there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS & one compulsory CVAC in Constitutional Values.
- In the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS & the students shall select the other CVAC from a pool of courses.

#### G) Summer Internship:

- All the students are required to do one 3 credits Summer Internship at the end of the 2<sup>nd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> or 6<sup>th</sup> semester.
- Students completing Internship at the end of the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded Certificate of 45 credits.





- Students completing Internship at the end of the 4<sup>th</sup> semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded Diploma of 88 credits.
- Students completing Internship at the end of the 6<sup>th</sup> semester and after successful completion
  of all the 6 semesters will be awarded B.A./B.Sc. Degree of 128 credits.

#### H) Inter Disciplinary Course (IDC):

- There shall be 3 IDCs of 3 credits each, to be studied in the first 3 semesters.
- The students shall take IDC from the different subjects other than the Core subjects and Minor subjects, not more than one from the each of the Multidisciplinary Pool.









#### 10. Disciplines:

There will be three broad disciplines:

i) Science and ii) Humanities & Languages iii) Home Science

#### Types of subjects:

- i) <u>Core Courses:</u> All students shall have to take 16 (sixteen) Core Courses from 2 (two) subjects taking 8 (eight) from each core subjects.
- ii) Minor course: A subject to be studied by the student with lesser number of courses other than the two core subjects. All students shall have to study 6 (six) courses from Minor subject.

#### iii) Inter Disciplinary Course (IDC):

- A student will have to opt for three IDCs (one in each of the first three semesters) from a pool
  of courses offered in the different disciplines.
- These courses must be different from the Core and Minor subject.

#### iv) Skill Enhancement Course (SEC):

SEC courses are based upon skill enhancement.

The students shall study 3 SECs 1 from each of 2 core and 1 minor subject taken.

#### v) Common Value Added Course (CVAC):

- There shall be 4 CVAC courses of 2 credits each.
- In the 1<sup>st</sup> semester there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS & one CVAC in Constitutional Values.
- In the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS & the students shall select the other CVAC from a pool of courses.

#### vi) Ability Enhancement Course (AEC):

- All students shall have to study 4 AEC courses of 2 credits each (one in each of the first 4 semesters).
- There will be a compulsory AEC, named Compulsory English which shall be studied in the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> semesters.
- There will be an optional AEC (MIL: Bengali) to be studied in the 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> semesters.

## **Additional Information**

- Two copies of Passport size photographs are required at the time of admission.
- At the time of admission, the original admit card and mark sheet of i.e. secondary (Madhyamik) and the Higher Secondary examinations, or of any other equivalent examinations, have to be produced.

### **Anti-Ragging Cell:**



#### **Minority Welfare Cell:**


The college has a Minority Welfare Cell to look after the causes of the Minority

The Raidighi college library is housed in a big and spacious room on the ground floor of the

Acharya Jagadish Chandra Bose building. Students may borrow books from the library either

Apart from this, the college collaborates with the Students' Health Home to assist the bonafide students with medical attention.


#### Students' Common Room:

Responding to the need for purification of drinking water, the college has installed Water Purifier. The teachers, staffs and the students get uninterrupted supply of purified drinking water.




#### **Green Generator**

## **GENERAL INFORMATION**

### **Identity Card**

After admission a student is required to get an identity card signed by the Principal of the college, containing information about the student concerned, The identity card is a proof of his/her status as a student of Raidighi College. The possession of this card entitles his/her to the rightful privilege as a student of this college and the use of library facilities of the college. The loss of college identity card should be reported to the college authority.

## Discipline in the College

Discipline is the most essential requirement for any kind of progress. Therefore, the college is always prepared to take any step that it deems fit in order to ensure that strict and proper discipline is maintained at all times in the college premises. In this respect, it may be mentioned that it is mandatory for students to follow certain rules and regulations:

Polite and respectful behavior towards the teachers and nonteaching staff of the College and their fellow students is expected from a student of Raidighi College.

- \* Students will maintain silence in the college library and in the class room.
- Students should not loiter unnecessarily or talk on the college corridors.
- \* The laboratory is meant only for serious academic work. Absolute silence needs to maintain outside the laboratory. Students should not loiter unnecessarily in the adjoining area.
- ❖ No indecent behavior, vulgar language, or activities, or disrupting the smooth functioning and academic atmosphere of the college, will be tolerated on the college premises.
- \* Students are not allowed to use cell phones and other gadget during class lectures and practical classes. Use of cell phones is strictly prohibited in the examination hall.
- \* The college campus should be kept clean at all times. The college campus is a plastic-free zone.

- \* Students must inform their guardians regarding parent-teacher meeting when notified by the college.

\* Students must go through the college notice-board regularly for information.

- \* All the students of the college are expected to participate in college activities like sports and cultural programmes.
- \* Students must take note that the college campus and the library is under CCTV surveillance.

#### Attendance

According to the regulations of Calcutta University, each student will have to attend at least 75% of the classes held in each subject. If a student's attendance is below 75% but not below 60%, he/she may take the University examinations as a non-Collegiate candidate, subject entirely however, to the discretion of the college authorities. Students whose attendance is below 60% will not be allowed to take sit for the University examination at any cost.

## Information regarding Syllabus

At the beginning of each academic session, syllabus of each subject to be taught, both in Honours and Generic Courses, along with module distribution is notified to the students by the respective departments.

### **Examination Regulation**

There will be no college examination like midterm and selection tests for students under the new choice based credit system.

## Academic Calendar

The academic calendar, stating dates of important college events is distributed to the students at the beginning of each academic year, so that they can plan their activities well in advance. It includes dates of academic events like college examination and probable dates of university examination, publication of college results, schedules of firm-fill up as well as extra-curricular activities and competitions organized by the college.

## Departmental Seminar

All the Departments organize at least two departmental seminars in each Academic Year as a part of Co-curricular activities by eminent speakers in the respective fields. All the students are to attend the seminars of their respective departments mandatorily.

## **Compulsory Excursion**

As per rule of the University of Calcutta, Geography, Botany and Zoology departments are required to take their students on excursions related to academic projects in their respective areas. Students studying these subjects at the Honours level are required to participate in these excursions. The place of excursion is decided each year by the department concerned. The charges of excursions are to be paid by the students separately. At least one faculty member accompanies the students on excursions

#### **Educational Tour:**

Besides the compulsory excursions, other departments like food and Nutrition, History, Botany and zoology also organizes educational trips to places of their respective interests.
